Northcliffe Student Ministry exists to lead students to Love God personally, Live life purposely, and Serve others passionately! - Student Life Groups
Life Groups allow the students to dig deeper into God's Word in a small classroom setting. Each group explores what it means to be a child of God while sharing life together. Life Groups meet each Sunday at 9:00 AM in the Family Life Center.
- IMPACT
Every Wednesday night during the school year, students gather to worship at 6:30 PM in the Family Life Center. This time of worship is structured to meet the specific needs of our city's teenagers.

- Deeper - High School Home Group
Deeper is a home group for High School students on Sundays from 6-8 p.m. It is designed to dig deeper into the Bible to help teenagers navigate challenges and struggles in today's world. It's a perfect opportunity for students to engage in fellowship and community with their peers.

The Discipleship Pathway

At Northcliffe, we are committed to following God in every corner of our lives. The Discipleship Pathway is designed to help us understand our faith and find ways to participate in the life of Northcliffe. The Discipleship Pathway starts with understanding our

shared faith, identifying how God has prepared you for His plans, leading other disciples, and connecting with the mission of the local church. The Discipleship Pathway consists of four areas that our elders will lead people through as they discover our shared beliefs and how God has placed them to serve His Kingdom.

Care Ministries

The Care Ministry exists to help provide compassionate care to people in their times of need. Below are some ways we meet needs and show love at Northcliffe.

The Food Pantry: We offer free groceries to people in our church and community on Tuesdays from 2:00 to 4:00 PM and Thursdays from 10:00 AM to Noon at the Food Pantry Center.

The Food Kitchen: We provide a free sit-down lunch to those in need every Thursday from 11:00 AM to Noon in the Fellowship Hall.

Threads of Love: This ministry makes quilts and other items to be given to people in hospitals, assisted living facilities, hospices, and those restricted to their homes. They also do special projects like quilts for cancer centers and blankets for pregnancy crisis centers. This group meets on Thursdays from 9:00 AM to Noon in Room A-7.

Widow Care Calls: Each month, we call our known widows to see how they are doing, how we can pray for them, and to remind them that God loves them, and we do, too!

Pastoral Care: Our part-time Pastor of Care visits members and regular attendees each week in area hospitals, rehabs, assisted living facilities, and hospices. He also assists with funerals and counseling and oversees our care ministries.

One of the often overlooked aspects of leadership at Northcliffe are our four volunteer Lead Teams. Without any of these teams, it would be a serious challenge for Northcliffe to function properly. Each of the following teams require that you have been a member of the church for one year. These teams are an amazing way to step in and take part in leading Northcliffe church to accomplish what God has laid before the church to do.

Nominating Team

The primary responsibility of the Nominating Team is to help fill the teams listed below with team members who can serve well in their respective areas. When Team members rotate off or step down from a particular team, the Nominating Team then works with members of the Northcliffe family to fill that role of service in the life of the church. To be a successful member of this team, it is helpful to be willing to understand the functions of the other teams and speak with people about serving in those capacities.

Personnel Team

The Personnel Team is responsible for recommending the hiring of new staff members other than the Lead Pastor. Additionally, the Personnel Team manages all employee salaries, benefits, and addresses all other personnel issues if/when they arise. A successful member of the Personnel Team will have a familiarity and willingness to engage with employees and seek to serve them as they serve the church.

Finance Team

The Finance Team of Northcliffe is responsible for the finances of the church and making information available to the church body as necessary. They work hard to help create a budget for the life of the church, and then help manage the ministry resources throughout the year, ensuring we are being good stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. Successful members of this team will be comfortable working with and creating budgets, be willing to serve as counters and collectors of the weekly offering, and have a heart for thinking through how to financially support the ministry of Northcliffe Church.

Facilities Team

The Facilities Team is primarily responsible for handling the church's property and buildings owned by the church. They oversee and lead the maintenance of the church and organize days where we can serve the church by helping to give life to the property with which God has blessed us as a community of faith. This team partners closely with Northcliffe's Director of Operations, Jonathan King, and Facilities Manager, Mark Keene.
